

YOU ARE ELIGIBLE FOR NATURALIZATION AND THIS CITIZENSHIP WORKSHOP IS FOR YOU IF:

- ☐ You are at least 18 years old
- ☐ You are a legal permanent resident (green card holder)
- ☐ You have continuously resided in the U.S. for at least 5 years
 - ☐ or you're married to a U.S. citizen and you have continuously resided in the U.S. for at least 3 years; or you received your green card because you were battered or abused by your U.S. citizen spouse and have continuously resided in the U.S. for at least 3 years
- ☐ You have been physically present in the U.S. for at least 2½ out of the past 5 years
 - ☐ or you're married to a U.S. citizen and you have been physically present for at least 1½ years
- ☐ You have "good moral character"
- ☐ You can speak, read, and write simple English
 - ☐ or you are at least 55 years old and have been a permanent resident for at least 15 years
 - ☐ or you are at least 50 years old and have been a permanent resident for at least 20 years
 - ☐ or you have a disability that prevents you from learning English
- ☐ You know basic U.S. government and history
 - ☐ or you have a disability that prevents you from learning U.S. government and history

** Even if you don't meet all the requirements listed, you may still qualify for naturalization. Please call us or an experienced immigration lawyer for further information and assistance.*

Please bring the following documents to the workshop:

- ☐ A copy of both sides of your Permanent Resident Card ("green card").
- ☐ Your California ID or Driver's License.
- ☐ Your passport(s) (current and expired ones if you have any).
- ☐ Your 2016 Taxes & W-2's or a recent Verification of Benefits from DPSS or SSI award letter to see if you qualify for a fee waiver or a reduced fee.
- ☐ If you are not eligible for a fee waiver, the application fee of \$725 (or \$640 if 75 or older), by check or money order, payable to "Department of Homeland Security." Cash will not be accepted.
